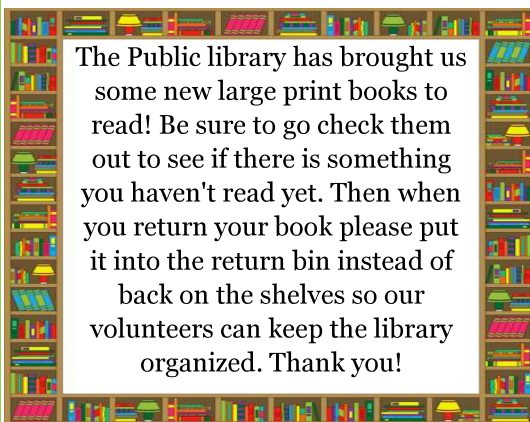
RE: Emergency Protocols
